HIGHWAYS UPDATES

A149 - ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN

The Town Council has been working with other agencies over the safety concerns on the A149 and welcomes the news that a Highways Safety Review will be undertaken. This would not have been possible without the local support and representation raising the profile and bringing all the necessary agencies together.

SPEEDING IN THE TOWN.

The Town Council has a SAM 2 camera, which not only flashes the speed to drivers, but also records the data so that the Council can use this to support requests for enforcement attendance. In response to recent complaints an additional location was approved and the camera has completed the first deployment on Yarmouth Road. results show that vehicles entering the town from Sutton are largely within the speed limit. The same cannot be said for traffic leaving the town! Whilst the device does not register individual vehicles it has proven that complaints are entirely valid and the Council will be working with local police teams to ensure that speed limits are adhered to in this area.

Please, when driving within the town and nearby - obey the speed limits.

HIGHWAYS UPDATES CONT...

OLD MARKET ROAD CROSSING

The Town Council has been made aware that the lights on this crossing are not operational, even though the screens have been removed. The commission of this crossing sits with the developer McCarthy and Stone who have been in contact with the Town Council and are working hard to ensure that it is lit as soon as possible. Currently it is unclear to both pedestrians and car drivers whether or not this is a crossing – if you are a car driver please take extra care in this area, pedestrians may consider they have a right of way.

What Do Councillors Do?

Parish and Town Councillors (Cllrs) act as ambassadors for their community, they represent the voice of their community as a whole and work at the lowest tier of Local Government.

North Norfolk District Council is the next tier, Norfolk County Council the third, and then the Government.

All Councils have elections to elect Cllrs every 4 years, In Stalham the elections are next due in May 2023 for both the Town Council, and the District Council representatives.

In May each year a Chairman, or in Stalham's case a Mayor, is elected at the Annual Parish Meeting of the Town Council.

Councils have a wide range of legal powers and duties. They are governed by Local Government Legislation and abide by a Code of Conduct.

Town Cllrs are unpaid, they attend Council and committee meetings and carry out the work of the Council.

Chamber of Commerce

The first meeting took place at the Poppy Centre where local businesses were invited to come along and feed into the development of a Stalham Chamber of Commerce, shaping the objectives and discussing the benefits that this could provide locally.

Town Council is now actively pursuing the development of a Chamber of Commerce to both represent local businesses and bring opportunities, training and resources into the Town to support our local businesses who in turn support our residents.

Suggestions for sessions to date include: Zero Carbon Support to Businesses; Effective Marketing; Business Support and Grants; HR and Health and Safety updates. The Council will be looking to bring specialists in as guest speakers to work with local business.

Stalham Town Council monitors and looks after many areas in the Town such as street-lights, the burial ground and closed cemeteries, green areas and the staithe, all to ensure Stalham is a safe and pleasant town to reside in and visit. The following is an update on some of the ongoing tasks.

Burial Ground

Stalham Town Councillors are keen to ensure the burial ground is a quiet and pleasant area where residents can visit their loved ones and offer a place of reflection. Council will ensure the area is managed and maintained for many years to come and is actively involved in securing contractors to complete the area cleared for an extension to the burial area. This is a priority as Council needs to ensure we have sufficient room for anyone wishing to inter their relatives on their passing.

Council is also looking to secure the perimeter fencing/hedging to ensure visitors use the official entrance, this should also reduce damage to the newly prepared areas. Finally, Council have planted 400 crocus bulbs in the hope it will improve the appearance of the area around the entrance and along the edge of the internal roadway and will continue to review the planting options to maintain the burial ground appearance.

Permission has recently been granted by North Norfolk District Council to undertake tree works in the wooded area on trees that are suffering from Ash Dieback. This will also enable the area to be managed ready to be brought into use in due course.

The Staithe

The Staithe area has been a focus for the Council over the past few months with the quay heading being repaired and the addition of a picnic bench complete with wheelchair access. Council have also purchased a noticeboard which is due to be installed very shortly on the picnic area for the area to improve communication for both residents and visitors.

Bike Racks

There was a recent initiative from North Norfolk District Council who were identifying sites for the installation for free of charge bike racks. Stalham has successfully been granted three bike racks, one at the Museum of the Broads, one at the Recreation Ground, and one at the Picnic Area at the Staithe.

Town Council Catch-up continued

Stalham Pond

The pond in Stalham is essential for drainage of the area around it and, once again, it has been cleared of the years growth by volunteers to maintain its biological function. Recent meetings between Town, District and County Councils have been held to ensure the drainage infrastructure is maintained thereby keeping water levels are kept at the desired levels.



Allotments

Work to improve the roadway within the allotment area is underway and also for construction of a compost area for allotment holders to place the compostable material and to use the contents when needed. Pest control is an ongoing issue and contractors have been secured for the coming year.


STALHAM POPPY CENTRE & RECREATION GROUND
